ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER
94-14

WHEREAS, Arizona Supreme Court Chief Justice Stanley G. Feldman executed Administrative order 94-37 which provides that all courts shall be automate business functions by December 31, 1994 and such automated systems shall include, at a minimum, case management, court financial/cash management, and statistical reporting; and

WHEREAS, the plan to automate the Mohave County Courts consists of a single, county-wide solution approved by the Mohave County Presiding Judge meets requirements established by the said Order and the Administrative Director of the Courts; and

WHEREAS, the Mohave County Board of Supervisors approved intergovernmental agreements with Bullhead City, Kingman, and Lake Havasu City to support this plan by and through the Presiding Judge on October 4, 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Mohave County Board of Supervisors agreed to consider consolidation of the Moccasin Justice Court and Colorado City Municipal Court through an intergovernmental agreement with Colorado City prior to July 30, 1995 to meet financial obligations for their pro-rata share of the court automation project on October 4, 1994; and

WHEREAS, the Mohave County Board of Supervisors and the Mohave County Presiding Judge agreed to a Memorandum of Understanding on management of the court automation project on October 4, 1994 which included the appointment of the Committee on Court Automation and Executive Committee and establishment and management of the Court Automation Enterprise Fund;

NOW THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED THAT:

1. The Mohave County Committee on Court Automation is hereby established to manage and oversee the court automation project, resolve policy issues related to the project, adopt implementation schedules, and manage the Court Automation Enterprise Fund including the purchase, installation and maintenance of the hardware, software,

and related technology required for the court automation project and for professional services as may be required for the efficient installation, operation, and management of the project consistent with Mohave County budgetary policies and procedures.

2. The Mohave County Court Automation Executive Committee is hereby established to oversee the daily business affairs of the Committee on Court Automation and to ensure efficient management thereof.
3. The following persons are appointed to the Mohave County Committee on Court Automation:



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
