Project AIM strives to provide services and safe spaces for delinquent youth and their families in Mohave County.

Strategies

- Repurpose part of the existing Mohave County Juvenile Detention Facility to create a welcoming environment for recreational, educational and family programming
- Employ Youth Care Workers full time for staffing and oversight
- Partner with Arizona @ Work to provide tutoring and job skill development
- Partner with Arizona Youth Partnership for Strengthening Families Curriculum
- Partner with PSA Behavioral Health to provide therapeutic art to all participants
- Partner with local organizations for special presentations and projects
- Provide on-site counseling for youth and families
