

All initial protective order hearings shall be assigned to a protective order judge pursuant to the matrix.

When a request for contested hearing is filed,

- 1) if there is a pending DO with the same parties, then the matter shall be transferred by the protective order judge to the DO judge.
- 2) If there is a prior DO involving children with the same parties, then the matter shall be transferred by the protective order judge to the judge who handled the DO matter *if that judge agrees to such transfer.*

In emergency situations, the following are designated as the point of contact and decision maker regarding the respective buildings, courtrooms, and office spaces:

- KNG: Judge McCoy, and in her absence Judge Carlisle
- BHC: Judge Moss, and in his absence Judge Williams
- LHC: Judge Camacho, and in his absence Judge Esplin

Superior Court criminal cases are assigned to judges in the following order of priority:

1. Notices / petitions for post-conviction relief are assigned to the sentencing judge, whether or not the sentencing judge is still assigned a criminal caseload.
2. Rule 11's from limited jurisdiction courts are assigned to the presiding criminal judge.
3. Probation violations are assigned to the sentencing judge, if the sentencing judge is assigned a criminal caseload.
4. If a defendant is on probation and is charged in a new case, whether or not there is a probation violation, the new case is assigned to the sentencing judge of the probation case, if the sentencing judge is assigned a criminal caseload.
5. If a defendant has a case pending in the superior court, any new case in which the defendant is charged is assigned to the same judge as the pending case.
6. If a judge takes over a criminal caseload from another judge, the new judge will only take over open, pending cases and, for purposes of rules 3 and 4, probation cases in which the previous judge was the sentencing judge.
7. Co-defendants are assigned to the same judge.
8. If provisions 1 – 7 do not apply, the case is assigned based on the case assignment matrix.
